## Post 16 pathways

Please note open evenings for colleges are still taking place at some venues and we would encourage you and your young person to take a look if they are currently in year 11. Young people should still be in some form of education or training until they are 18 and there are a variety of places available at different settings such as:

- -The Opportunity Centre (previously Aspire-igen).
- -Shipley College
- -Craven College
- -Keighley College
- -Bradford College

There are also a host of other opportunies for young people such as NCS and organisations such as YMCA and Brathay who have opportunities for post 16. If you need any support with this please let us know.
